The event highlighted exceptional talent and fostered a sense of camaraderie among the houses. We appreciate to all the dancers for their captivating performances and making the competition a memorable success!



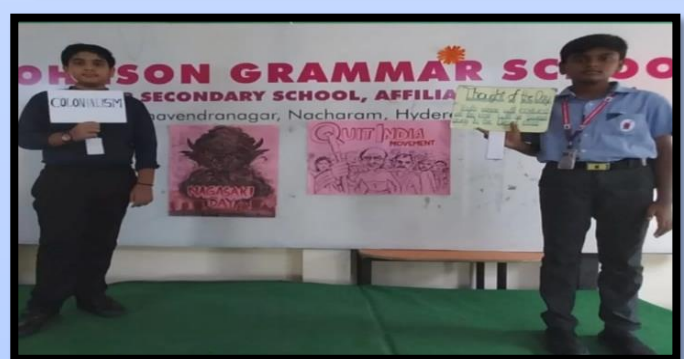
QUIT INDIA MOVEMENT & NAGASAKI DAY

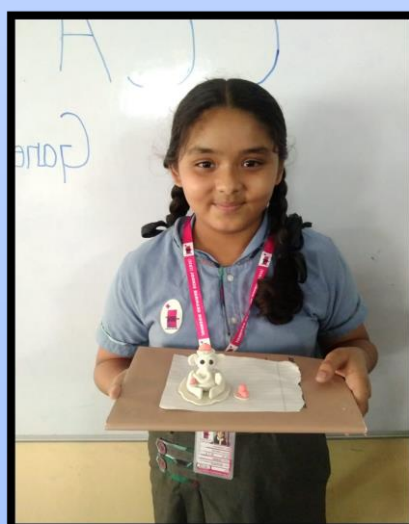
This competition not only encourages creativity but also helps the students understand the cultural significance of Raksha Bandhan.

'Being creative is not hobby. It's a way of life.'

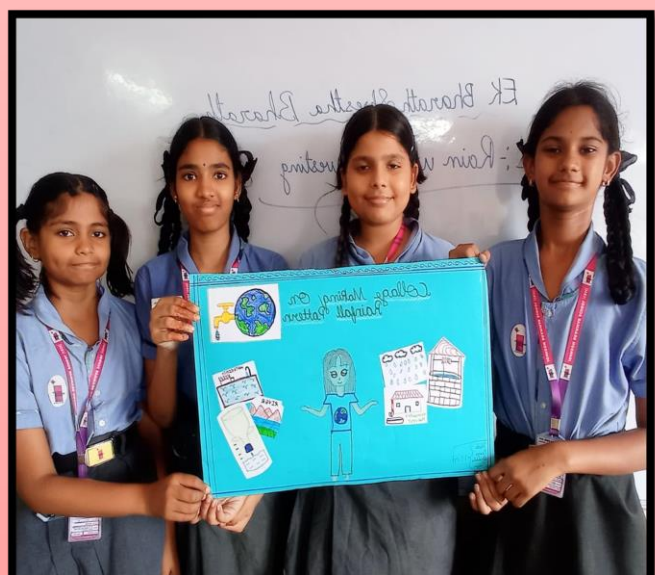
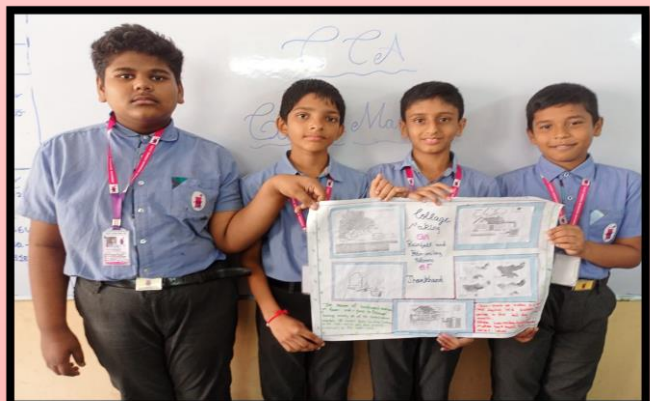

The skit was not only a tribute to the spirit of the movement but also a powerful reminder of the courage and resilience shown by those who fought for our independence.



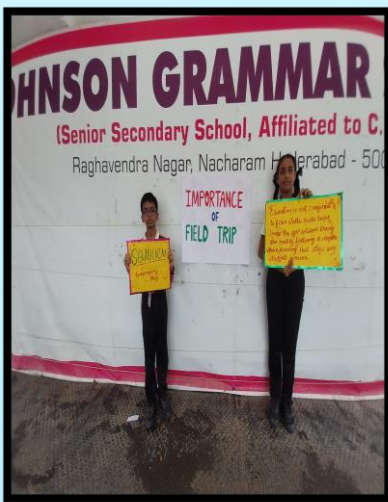
THE VALUE OF FIELD TRIPS IN EDUCATION
