FUN WITH ORDINAL NUMBERS-HANDS-ON-LEARNING

In a lively and engaging lesson on ordinal numbers, the students of Grade II explored the concept of order and position using hands-on activities with concrete objects. This practical activity helped students grasp the meaning of ordinal numbers (1st, 2nd, 3rd...) in a fun and interactive way.

Students were asked to begin by arranging a series of small objects in a line on the table. The sequence of toys provided a clear visual for understanding positions, then each student received an ordinal number card and was asked to place it next to the corresponding object in the sequence.

After positioning the cards, students reviewed the sequence as a group, answering questions about the position of each object to reinforce their understanding of ordinal numbers.

Later to deepen their understanding, students rearranged the objects and used the ordinal number cards to place them in the correct order again, reinforcing the concept through practice.

This activity provided students with a tangible way to understand and apply ordinal numbers, enhancing their ability to identify and use these numbers in various contexts.















WHAT DOES THE SHAPE SAY?

To introduce Grade I students to basic geometric shapes such as circles, squares, triangles, and rectangles through interactive and hands-on activities that promote understanding and identification, the teachers engaged the students in fun activities. To make learning about shapes fun and memorable, the students also recited rhymes and sang songs on shapes along with their teachers who taught them the characteristics of shapes.

This activity fostered a deeper understanding of shapes and helped develop their observation and cognitive skills in a fun and engaging way.
