"Learning is not just about books; its about exploring the world around us."

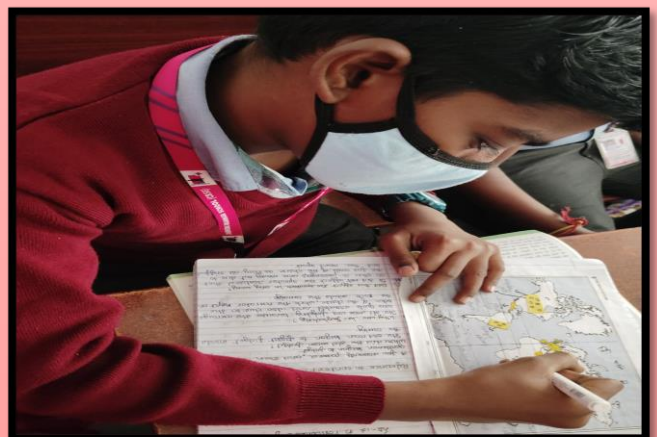
