

EVS ACTIVITY "Lighter than a feather, heavier than you think!"

The students of Grade II were engaged in a fun and interactive activity to explore the invisible yet powerful properties of air, fostering curiosity and understanding of the natural world.

This activity enabled students to develop experiential learning, scientific thinking and also to build fine and gross motor skills.
