

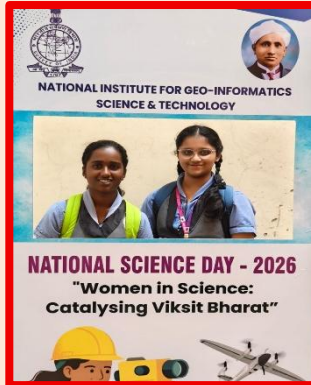

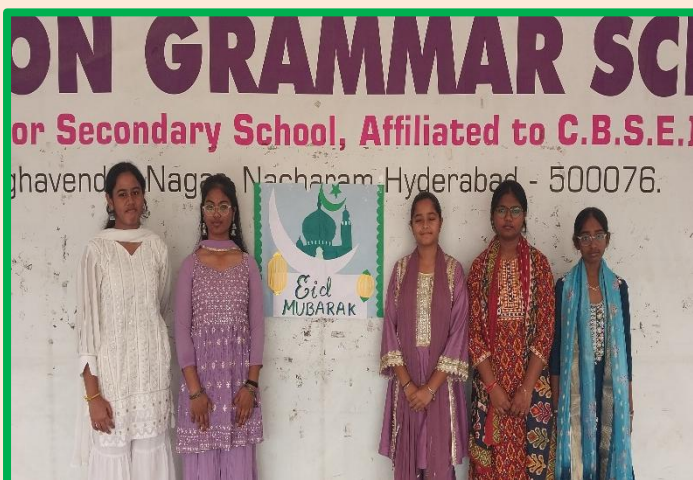
UGADI CELEBRATIONS
