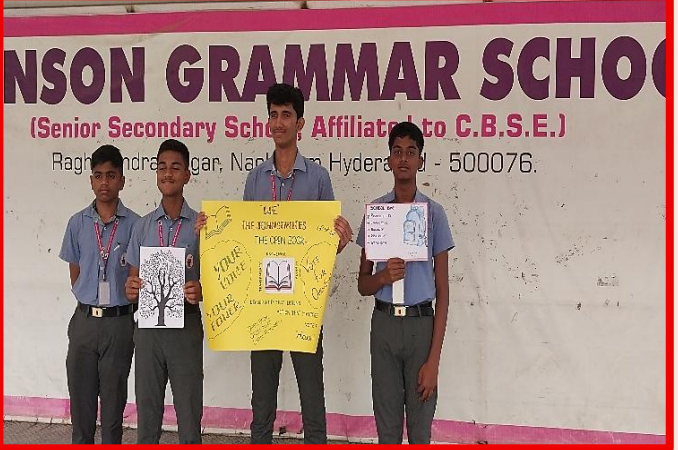
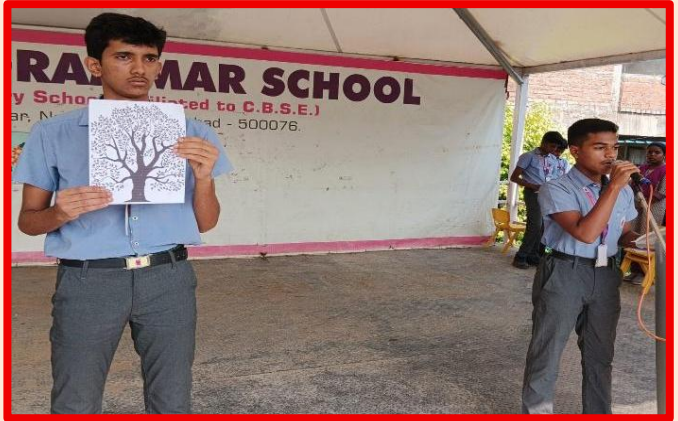


Election Campaign

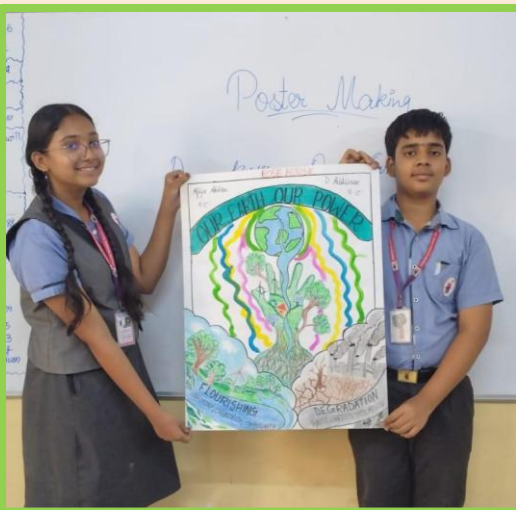




WORLD EARTH DAY
